DID YOU KNOW? (Facts about Benin)

- 1. There are **55 languages** spoken in Benin. 20 of those do not have any Scripture available yet.
- 2. The official language of Benin is **French**.
- 3. Benin is home to Ganvie: Africa's largest **lake village**. The town was erected on stilts in Lake Nokoue by people evading being captured and sold into slavery.

- 4. With a **median age of just 17**, Benin has one of the youngest populations in the world. 65% are under the age of 25. Women in Benin have 5 children on average!
- 5. From the 17th century until the late 19th century, Benin (then known as Dahomey) had the only **all female army** in modern history.
- 6. Three African nations are monarchies (Morroco, Lesotho, and Eswatini) but there are many **non-sovereign kings** who reign over a dominion within a sovereign state, like Benin. In Benin, some kings double as heads of Vodun (voodoo) religion and are believed to have spiritual powers.
