

## Surgery/Recovery update

Hello Friends! I am **more than halfway** through recovery from surgery — past the 3 week mark of expected 6 week recovery! My surgery was successful. The surgeon was super excited that my transplanted kidney wasn't anywhere near where the tumor was — which was the biggest risk: that the kidney or its connectors could be damaged during surgery. The tumor was benign as expected. All that's left is for me to recover.

Meanwhile, three years ago at work we had a rash of people getting married and having babies. Now we're having a rash of people getting sick and having surgeries. We liked the former better. Please pray for healing and recovering, for no more people to have serious health issues, and also for additional (healthy ) IT people to join our team.
