Charting the Course from High School to College English in the RMI



Memorandum of Understanding between The Public School System and The College of the Marshall Islands



This memorandum of understanding (MOU) sets out the partnership terms and understanding between the Public School System and the College of the Marshall Islands in order to cooperate on the Charting the Course from High School to College English in the RMI project.

Background

The Charting the Course from High School to College English in the RMI, established by this MOU, addresses concerns about the large number of PSS high school graduates who are unable to begin college-level work immediately and who, as a result, often struggle to complete their college degrees. Today, most students graduating from high schools in the RMI do not possess the required knowledge and skills in reading, writing, listening, and speaking to enroll directly into CMI credit English courses. As is the case in many parts of the world, most recent high school graduates in the RMI place into non-credit-bearing English courses when they first enroll in college, which research suggests contributes to high dropout rates.

In part, this is due to a mismatch between the current English content taught at the high-school level and the knowledge skills students need to successfully pass credit-level English courses. At CMI, the English courses required of all degree-seeking students are ENG 111: Composition I and ENG 105: Fundamentals of Speech.

To address this issue, leaders and faculty from both PSS and CMI will design a 12th grade English course that will promote students' English learning and engagement. The aim is that successful completion of this course will allow students to move directly to credit courses following high school graduation. This project is modeled after the Building Better Math Pathways from the RMI Public School System to the College of the Marshall Islands project, completed with the support of the REL Pacific: Regional Educational Laboratory, which led to an increase in the percentage of high school graduates entering directly into college-level work.

Purpose

This MOU outlines the intended outcomes of the project and the joint responsibilities of both organizations to ensure the outcomes are met. Through a series of meetings and workshops the parties will develop the following products:

- Curriculum for a 12th grade English transition course to be offered by the Public School System starting in fall 2023 that will:
 - a. address required college-readiness skills, knowledge, and abilities in the subject of English;
 - b. meet students' social-emotional needs; and
 - a include culturally appropriate materials relevant to students' lives.
- 2. A mutually agreed upon and appropriate summative assessment for the course that will allow students who pass to enter directly into credit-level English without further requirements.
- 3. A resource bank of meaningful classroom activities to support the curriculum.
- 4. A plan for continuous, collaborate improvement of the course and teaching

These products are intended to support achievement of the following outcomes:

- By 2024, 25% of students enrolled in the transition course will be eligible for credit-bearing English courses at CMI immediately following high school graduation.
- By 2025, 50% of students enrolled in the transition course will be eligible for credit-bearing English courses at CMI immediately following high school graduation.
- By 2026-75% of students enrolled in the transition course will be eligible for credit-bearing English courses at CMI immediately following high school graduation.

Activities

The project outcomes will be accomplished through the collaboration of relevant high school and CMI faculty and staff who will meet for a minimum of three full-day workshops as a full group, with additional meetings and working group meetings as needed to achieve the goals of the project. PSS and CMI faculty and staff commit to a professional partnership based on improved collaboration, coordination, and sharing of expertise and skill, underscored by a shared commitment to student achievement and success.

PSS commits to

 Collaboration in the development of the new fit-for-purpose English transition course and assessment

- Delivery of the new transition course, including new materials and improved pedagogies
- Engagement in professional support
- Supporting students' academic skills development and social-emotional learning needs
- Designing a plan to ensure the involvement of parents and community in student learning
- Providing results of the agreed assessment to CMI

CM! commits to

- Hosting the workshops described above
- Collaboration in the development of the new fit-for-purpose English transition course and assessment
- Supporting the delivery of the course as discussed and agreed upon by both parties
- Placing high school graduates into credit-level English courses on the basis of the assessment results
- Supporting high school staff in the process of marking the final assessment to ensure the integrity of the results

Duration

This MOU is at-will and may be modified by mutual agreement of the parties or terminated by either one of the parties. This MOU shall become effective upon signature by authorized officials of PSS and CMI and will remain in effect unless and until modified or terminated.
