



Transfer Agreement

COLLEGE OF THE MARSHALL ISLANDS AND EASTERN OREGON UNIVERSITY

Eastern Oregon University (EOU) and the College of the Marshall Islands (CMI) enter into this Transfer Agreement regarding the transfer credits that CMI students will receive upon admission to EOU.

Background

The College of the Marshall Islands is chartered by the Republic of the Marshall Islands to provide post-secondary education to the Marshall Islands. CMI has been accredited since 1993 by the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC).

Eastern Oregon University is a public university of the State of Oregon, United States of America. EOU has been continuously accredited since 1931 by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities and its predecessor agencies.

CMI and EOU share the goal of increasing access to educational opportunities for all students, and eliminating barriers toward the attainment of their educational goals. We are entering into this agreement to better serve students and to create a partnership of mutual benefit for both institutions.

Transfer Credits

For those CMI students who are admitted to EOU, EOU will award transfer credit for CMI classes as indicated on the chart attached as Exhibit A: CMI Course Equivalencies for EOU General Education. EOU's decisions regarding the transfer of any other CMI 100-level courses will be based on the requirements of the transfer guidelines listed in the Eastern Oregon University catalog. Admission Requirements

EOU shall apply these transfer credits to CMI students who are admitted to EOU. Admission to EOU is not guaranteed. CMI students shall apply for admission to EOU, and EOU shall act on those applications, in accordance with the then-existing rules, policies, and procedures of EOU.

Termination

Either party may terminate or suspend this agreement upon six (6) months written notice to the other party. The transfer credits of any student who has transferred from CMI to EOU shall not be affected by the subsequent termination, suspension, or expiration of this agreement.

Entire Agreement

This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties. No waiver, consent, modification or change of terms of this agreement shall bind either party unless in writing and signed by both parties. Such waiver, consent, modification, or change, if made, shall be effective only in the specific instance and for the specific purpose given. There are no understandings, agreements or representations, oral or written, not specified herein regarding this agreement.

Effectiveness; Date.

This agreement will become effective when all the parties have signed it. Each party is signing this agreement on the date stated opposite that party's signature. The date this agreement is signed by the last party to sign it (as indicated by the date associated with that party's signature) will be deemed the date of this agreement.

Exhibit B: Eastern Oregon University General Graduation Requirements

- 180-minimum credits required to graduate from EOU
- Earn a EOU & overall GPA of at least a 2.00
- 60-minimum credits of upper division (300 & 400 level) credits required to graduate from EOU
- 60- General Education Core credits required to graduate from EOU
- 45- minimum credits must be earned from EOU
- 135-maximum credits that can be transferred to EOU from accredited institutions
- 12-maximum career and technical education (CTE) elective credits that can be transferred
- "C-" the minimum grade required in courses used to satisfy both Program and General Education requirements

An Associate of Arts in Liberal Studies will transfer in to EOU, which will complete the General Education requirement for the university.
